From the Capital District, Points North and very West Take NYS Thruway to Exit 25A. Take I-88 West toExit 15. Turn right off the exit. Turn left on Main (the first major intersection). Take the second right onto Ford

From Binghamton Area Take 1-88 to Exit 15. Turn left at the exit. Turn left on Main, (first major intersection). Take the second right onto Ford.

From the East Take Route 23 West to Oneonta. After Walmart and the Southside Mall, turn right on Foster/Lettis Hwy. Pass under I-88 and go left on Main St. Take the second right onto Ford.

From Downstate Take NYS State Thruway or the Palisades Pkwy then NY Routes 6 and 17. Either choice will get you to the Harriman Exit. From Harriman take the NYS Thruway to Exit 21. Follow the directions "from the East" above.

Beware If you know and like the "Roscoe way" of back roads to Oneonta, be advised that Route 206 from Roscoe to Walton is closed as of this writing due to flooding.
