We the undersigned two of the members of the religious society hereinafter mentioned do hereby certify that on the twenty fifth day of September instant [1848] the male persons belonging to a religious society in which Divine worship is celebrated according to the rites of the Universalist church and not already incorporated met at the place heretofore occupied by said church for the purpose of incorporating themselves and did then and there elect by plurality of votes Sanford Beach[,] Daniel Fuller and Edwin Baker as Trustees of said religious society and the said persons did then and there determine by a like plurality of votes that the said Trustees and their successors should forever hereafter be called and known as the first Universalist Society of Alfred and Amity[.] Witness our hands and seals this twenty seventh day of January 1849.
