Eighteen hundred and thirty-five pursuant to publick notice and according to the statute incorporating and regulating religious societies in such case made and provided[,] Davenport Alger and Horace J. Huntington were duly nominated and elected to preside at such Meeting and to certify and return the proceedings thereof to the Clerk of said county that at said meeting it was unanimously resolved and agreed that said Society should hereafter be known and distinguished by the name and title of the first Universalist Society in the town of Conesus[;] that the following persons were then duly elected trustees of said Society (to wit) Jedediah Huntington[,] Hosea Gilbert and Matthew Armstrong and that said trustees shall forever hereafter be known and called by the name and title of the first Universalist Society in the town of Conesus. In witness therefore [we] have hereunto set our hands and seals this nineteenth day of December eighteen hundred and thirty-five
