Albany Society

It is believed that this Society will now get through its pecuniary difficulties and stand upon a permanent basis. The call made to the friends of the cause throughout the State, to assist un liquidating the entire debt, has not been responded to as had been anticipated. But with such aid as they have reason to believe will be rendered them, the friends in Albany will succeed in reducing their debt, so that the present rent of the basement will pay the interest on the balance. This will place them in easy circumstances. It will be virtually paying the debt. To effect this, aid will be needed outside of the Society to the amount of \$1000. It is believed this amount can be raised. Will not those Societies which have taken up collections, but hold the money in reserve until they could learn the result, now forward the amounts raised, and thus assist in saving the church property in Albany, and establishing the Society on a permanent basis?
