I am in receipt of your esteemed favor of January 27th, acknowledging the receipt of the check which I sent you in payment of the bequest of my late mother. I conveyed the contents of your letter last evening to my sisters, to the effect that the fund would hereafter be known as the "Harriet D. Richardson Fund." They desire me to ask you whether the same could not be changed so as to read something as follows: "Harriet D. Richardson fund in memory of her father, Judge John B. Dygert." My mother many times spoke of doing something in memory of her father, who was a very prominent man in Frankfort in his day, being one of the County Judges of the County, as the law existed at that time. He was a very exemplary man in every respect, and my mother was very, very proud of him. She often spoke of endowing a scholarship at some Universalist institution, to be known as the John B. Dygert scholarship. She was unable to make up her mind upon this subject prior to the time of her death, but we know her desire in that regard, and would like to carry out her wishes if possible.
