Burke		in existence by 25 Jun 1851, when it sent a delegate to the St. Lawrence As'n. of Universalists ( <i>Christian Ambassador</i> , Auburn NY, 19 Jul 1851)		
Fort Covington	First Universalist Society of Fort Covington	org. on 1 <sup>st</sup> Monday of Feb 1830 ( <i>Evangelical Magazine &amp; Gospel Advocate</i> , Utica NY, 10 Apr 1830)		
Malone		“A Universalist society was formed not long after the war [of the Revolution] but had for many years been lost, when Dec. 27, 1845, it was formed. (F. B.
