





The Universalist Church or Society hereby grant to the Hubbardsvilke Fish and Game-Club for a period of two-years June 1st;1943 to June 1st,1945:

1. The Universalist Society of Hubbardsville shall have first use of said property whenever it so desires.

11. The Fish and Game Club of Hubbardsville is granted the use of the Auditorium for entertainments, which require it. To have private dances, use billiard or pool tables or shuffle-board and other gamtables games in the basement of said building.
