## DEDICATION

On Sunday morning last, the Universalist church in Grand street, lately occupied by the Episcopalians, was dedicated to the service of "the living God, who is the Saviour of all men." The services were as follows: Introductory and Dedicatory prayer, and reading select portions of Scripture, by Rev. B. BATES; Sermon by Rev. T. [Theophilus] FISK; concluding prayer, by Rev. A. [Abel] C. THOMAS.—Notwithstanding the unfavourable weather, a very large concourse of people gave their attendance. The day will long be remembered by all who were present. The prospects of the Society are flattering in the extreme. The church has lately been fitted up in a plain and beautiful manner. It is situated upon the highest ground in Grand, near Division street, and the location is one of the most pleasant in the city of New-York.
