WEBSTER WOMAN DIES SUDDENLY Goes to Her Room Exhausted and Breathes Her Last Alone

Mrs. Martha Barrett, 75 years old, died rather suddenly yesterday afternoon at the home of her birth in Webster. Mrs. Barrett had been ill for some time with consumption and on Friday night was much worse than usual. Yesterday morning, however, she dressed and appeared about the house. Toward noon she became exhausted and retired to her room.

Her brother, Charles Cobb, gave a New Year's dinner at the house, and about 2 o'clock members of the family went to Mrs. Barrett's room with her dinner. They found the woman breathing with great difficulty, and she died a few minutes later. Coroner Kleindienst was notified.

Mrs. Barrett leaves her brother, Charles Cobb; a sister, Mrs. Chauncey Thompson; a daughter, Mrs. Jay Knight, and four grandchildren.
