Lee Center Items

LEE CENTER, March 30, 1887

To the Editors of the ROMAN CITIZEN:

—The death of Daniel Eames, an old resident of Lee who for several months has been confined at the rooms of his son, A. J. Eames, by painful illness and physical disability, occurred on Saturday, the 26th inst., at 10 o'clock P.M. The funeral was held yesterday at 2 P.M., in the Universalist Church, Rev. D. Ballou, of Utica, officiating. Owing to the cold weather and bad roads, the attendance was not large. Deceased leaves a maiden sister, who was too feeble to attend the funeral, and two sons, A. Jerome of this place and James N. of Missouri, and one daughter, Mrs. Wm. T. [Tiendam?] of West Winfield, N.Y., besides several grand children. Mr. Eames had reached the age of some 85 years, and was in his younger days connected with our town school, either as teacher or inspector, besides holding other offices of trust. He was generally respected by his fellow citizens, and was a strong advocate of the temperance cause. He was also one of the strongest supporters of the Universalist doctrine. His remains were carried to the Sand-flat Cemetery for interment, where his late wife was buried several years ago.
