ANDREW J. EARLL

Andrew J. Earll, one of the best known residents of this town, died at St. Joseph's Hospital, Syracuse, Thursday, February 3, 1910, of dropsy, aged 72 years. He had been in failing health for some time, and entered St. Joseph's Hospital a few weeks ago for treatment.

Andrew J. Earll was a son of Hiram Earll [and Cynthia Root], and was born on the family homestead in the northern part of the town of Skaneateles in 1837. He was a lifelong resident of this town. On arriving at manhood he engaged in farming, operating one of the largest farms in town, about 400 acres, and at one time was an extensive hop grower. He was a prominent and active Democrat, and represented the town of Skaneateles in the Board of Supervisors for two terms, being elected in 1876 and 1877.

Mr. Earll was a man who had many warm friends and a wide circle of acquaintances. He was a constant attendant of the Universalist Church of Mottville. His wife (Miss Harriet Brown of Elbridge) died about seventeen year ago. He is survived by three children, Elwyn Earll of this town, and Mrs. Frank Austin and Miss Gladys Earll of Ithaca, N. Y.; also one brother, J. Murray Earll of Victoria, Mo., now the only survivor of a large family.

The time of the funeral is not yet announced.
