## DR. ISAAC EARLL

Dr. Isaac Earll, one of the oldest physicians in Syracuse, died last night at the family home, No. 811 South West street, aged 75 years.

Dr. Earll was a physician of the old school and many of the older residents of Central Square, Baldwinsville, Mottville and Skaneateles will remember him.

He was born in the village of Skaneateles in October, 1827. He studied medicine in the office of Dr. D. Van Slyke at Mottville, later attended lectures at Buffalo, and graduated at Geneva when but 21 years of age. The following year he married and moved to Central Square, where he remained about twelve years, building up a large practice at that place and the surrounding villages. He then moved to Baldwinsville, where he practiced for four years. At the end of this time he came to Syracuse.

The only public office Dr. Earll ever held was of ward physician in the old Fifth Ward several years ago. He was a member of the First Universalist Church.

For some time before his death Dr. Earll's heath was not good, and it is believed by his relatives that the long drives incident to his country practice were in a large measure responsible for undermining it.

The deceased leaves a widow, three daughters: Mrs. C. W. [Carrie Eva] Furlong of Ithaca, Mrs. O. P. [May] Fralich of this city, and Miss Irene Earll of New York city. He also leaves two brothers, A. J. Earll of Mottville, J. Murray Earll of St. Louis, and one sister, Mrs. C. C. Whitney of Clifton Springs, N.Y.

Friends have been invited to attend the private funeral service, which will be held at 4 o'clock Monday afternoon at the home. Interment will be made Tuesday at Mottville.
