—Charlon E. Easton, formerly a resident of this village, died at his home at Richfield Springs, Sunday evening, after a most protracted and painful illness. The funeral was held at the late residence of the deceased on Wednesday, the service being conducted by Rev. Mr. Horne, of the Universalist church, and the remains brought here for interment in the village cemetery. Deceased was a native of this village, having been born here seventy-one years ago, where he passed his youth and the early years of his manhood and where he is well and pleasantly remembered by many of the older inhabitants. At one time deceased resided in the west and was married to Mary E. Coapman at Wyocena, Wis., Dec. 14, 1860. Returning to this state he resided at this village, also at Clyde and at Moravia, but since 1884 he had been a resident of Richfield Springs, where he was actively and successfully engaged in business as a builder and contractor, erecting some of the finest and most substantial residences and business places in that village. Deceased was an active member of the Universalist church, and in politics a life long republican. He was also a member of the Royal Arcanum and of Lodge No. 482 F. and A. M. He was an active and enterprising citizen of untiring industry and integrity, a kind and devoted husband and father and a generous neighbor and friend. Besides his widow he is survived by one son, Dr. Fred E. Easton of Syracuse and one daughter, Mrs. Dallas Dodd of Waterbury, Conn.; also two sisters, Mrs. Hannah E. Holcomb of this place, and Mrs. Ellen M. Devendorf of Utica; and one brother, F. E. Easton of Iliion.
