Mrs. Mary E. Easton, widow of the late Charton E. Easton of Richfield Springs, formerly a resident of Cedarville, died at the home of her son, Dr. Fred E. She was a woman of high ideals who made her life one of great usefulness. All who knew her well recognized in her a type of the best womanhood, constantly devoted to the highest interests of her home and family, and her hospitable doors were always open to acquaintances and friends. She was an active member of the Universalist church and always greatly interested in church, Sunday school and charitable work. Her death is most sincerely regretted by an extended circle of friends. Her husband departed this life in Sept. 1906. She is survived by one son, Dr. F. E. Easton, of Syracuse, and one daughter, Mrs. Dallas Dodd.

The funeral was largely attended from the residence at Richfield Springs, Saturday afternoon, the services being conducted by the Rev. F. [Frank] O. Hokerk, of the Universalist church, and the interment being made in the family lot in the Cedarville cemetery.
