NEWARK ATTORNEY DIES

Brief Illness Fatal to John H. Egan, Prominent in Villages Affairs

Newark, June 27.—Funeral services for John H. Egan, village attorney, who succumbed to pneumonia yesterday at his home in Moore street, will be held at 2:30 P.M. Thursday afternoon from the residence in Moore street. Rev. Charles Palmatier [of the Universalist Church] will officiate. Burial will be made in the East Newark cemetery. The City Hall was draped in mourning yesterday afternoon immediately following the death of Mr. Egan at 3:30 p.m. Mr. Egan was born at Pittsford, March 19, 1864. He was graduated from Geneseo Normal School and for several years was a teacher. In 1901 he was admitted to the bar and he practiced law in Rochester, coming to Newark in 1906. He was married to Jennie A. Adams, of Livonia, and was the father of three children, (Jean?) H., Alice and Isabel.

Mr. Egan is survived, besides his wife and children, by three sisters, Mrs. W. D. Toole of Geneseo, Miss Mary Egan, of Geneseo, and Mrs. T. R. Hunt, of Rochester; also by three brothers, George Egan, of Marion, Va., Thomas Egan, of Victor, and William A. Egan, of Rochester. He was a member of the Eagles and the Modern Woodmen of the World. In addition to serving as a village attorney for a number of years, he also served as police justice.

During the time he served as village attorney he was largely instrumental in winning several important lawsuits for the village involving large sums of money.
