The death of Mrs. Elizabeth (VanHorne) Gould, widow of George L. Gould and a life-long resident of this village, occurred on Saturday at the Holford Nursing Home at Six-Mile Point following a long illness. Her age was 90.

Mrs. Gould, who was a descendant of one of the Cooperstown area's oldest settlers, was born in Pierstown on June 4, 1861, a daughter of Richard and Georgianna (Atkins) VanHorne. She received her education at the old Cooperstown Academy. About 70 years ago, she was married to Mr. Gould, a well-known Cooperstown merchant. His death occurred on May 30, 1910.

Mrs. Gould was a life-long member of the Universalist church of this village, and of Otsego Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution. She maintained a large collection of stamps and antiques at her home on Nelson avenue.

She is survived by a son, Percy W. Gould, acting postmaster at Morris; two grandchildren; a niece; and two nephews.

Funeral services were held Tuesday morning at 11 o'clock from the Tillapaugh Funeral Home here with the Rev. James Alcott, pastor of the First Universalist church of Oneonta, officiating. Burial was in Lakewood cemetery.
