## ROBERT GREGG

Death took one of Perry's pioneer residents in the passing last Friday, Feb. 14, of Robert Gregg, 87, who succumbed at the Warsaw hospital where he had been confined with a broken hip following a fall at his home on Feb. 5.

Mr. Gregg was born on Dec. 3, 1853, in a log house west of the lake on a farm on the property now occupied by N.R. Luther as a summer residence, one of six children of William and Ann Lindsley Gregg. His entire life had been lived in the vicinity of Perry. He attended school in the Oak Hill district and in young manhood acquired the farm at Oatka which he occupied until 1908, when he moved to Perry and made his home here since that time, altho retaining active interest in the farm until failing health caused his practical retirement about three years ago.

In 1877 he was united in marriage to Miss Anna Maria Campbell of Castile Center, whose death occurred about eight years ago. Two children, Miss Laura Gregg of Perry and Mrs. John Raymond (Florence) of Ormond Beach, Fla., survive.

Mr. Gregg was an industrious, capable and successful farmer and was widely known thruout this region. In addition to farming he dealt extensively in cattle and livestock and operated in partnership with the late L.A. Macomber and Elmer Abbott in the purchase and sale of cattle and feeding of sheep. A man of integrity and forthright views, his character and judgment were respected by friends and business associates alike.

Funeral services were held at Eaton's Funeral Home on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. Julia Tobey of the Universalist Church officiating. Interment was in the Glenwood Cemetery.
