She was kind to all friends and neighbors. She passed away peacefully, beloved by all, keeping her faculties clear until the very last, looking forward to a life in eternity with God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. A true wife, a devoted mother, full of faithfulness and loving sacrifices for her children that none but a mother can give. And when a loving mother's eye grows dim in death and we know that it will look on us no more, we know and feel that mother has left an influence that will go with us through life and that she will meet us at the golden gate.
