DIED SUDDENLY WHILE ON A VISIT CHARLES L. MACARTHUR, OF THIS CITY, PASSES AWAY AT SISTER'S HOME.

Charles L. MacArthur, a resident of this city, died suddenly Tuesday evening at the home of his sister, Mrs. J. E. Coons, at Little Falls, N.Y. Several months ago he suffered a shock [stroke] in this city and was taken to the City Hospital, where he was treated. Later he was able to leave that institution and about two weeks ago left for his sister's home to make a visit. According to word received here, Mr. MacArthur was feeling quite well when he suffered another shock and expired shortly afterward.

The deceased was well known in this city, where he spent the greater part of his life. He was employed as clerk in the Central House here and at the Smith House in Catskill for some time. For several years he was also employed in New York. He was a former president of Edmonds Hose Co. No. 1 of Hudson, and was held in high esteem not only by his many friends in firemanic circles but thruout the city. He was 46 years of age.

He is survived by one brother, Claude, who appeared at The Playhouse a short time ago as director of an opera company, and two sisters, Mrs. Joseph Brooksbanks, of this city, and Mrs. J. E. Coons, of Little Falls. The remains were brought to Hudson Wednesday afternoon.
