C. F. MALTBY, ARCHITECT, DIES AT 58

Charles F. Maltby, 58, an architect, died yesterday from a heart attack. He was stricken in the Kirby Office Equipment Company store, N. Main Street.

The Fire Department was called in an attempt to revive him. All efforts failed.
