DEATH OF HENRY MANNECK

Funeral services will be held this evening over the remains of Henry Manneck at his late residence, 119 Reid avenue. They will be conducted by the Rev. Charles R. East, pastor of the Universalist Church of Good Tidings [Fourth Universalist]. Mr. Manneck died Sunday of heart trouble, following a four years' illness. He was a widely known resident of the Bushwick section. He had lived in Brooklyn forty years, during which time he was a manufacturer of paper boxes at 32 Old Slip, Manhattan. The deceased was born in Hanover, Germany, on January 28, seventy years ago. Early in life he went to California in search of gold, and was one of the first white settlers on Vancouver Island. He is survived by a widow, three sons—Emile A. J., Charles H. and Julian A.—and three daughters, Mrs. J. Lahrenkrauss, Dorothy A. and Josephine H. Manneck. The interment will be in Evergreen Cemetery.
