

[Martin, Dean Garfield]

DEAN G. MARTIN

Monday morning our citizens heard with sorrow of the death of Dean Garfield Martin in his home near North Bloomfield in this town, where he was born June 22, 1865, and where he has always resided. Mr. Martin was the younger son of Amasa H. and Julia Ann Garfield Martin and was educated at Clinton Liberal Institute [a Universalist school], Fort Plain, N.Y. He was an up-to-date farmer and vice-president of the Edward F. Dibble Seed Company, to which he devoted much of his time the past few years. He was closely associated with the life of Honeoye Falls, and was chairman of the Redpath Chautauqua last summer. His great-grandfather was Stephen Martin, a Revolutionary soldier, and his grandfather, Alex. Martin, supervisor of Lima in 1836-43-48.

Mr. Martin leaves his wife, who was Miss Martha Windecker, of Little Falls, N.Y.; 2 daughters, Mrs. Myra Lawrence, Detroit, Mich. [and] Miss Carolyn Martin, Lima; a son, Harwood, Lima; a sister, Mrs. Geo. W. [Jane E.] Atwell, and a brother, Alexander Martin, both of Lima. The funeral was private and held Tuesday afternoon, Rev. B. B. Fairchild, former pastor of the North Bloomfield Universalist church, officiating. Interment was in North Bloomfield cemetery, where 3 generations are buried.
