Many at Rites for E. G. Martin, Ex-Business Manager of Eagle

Funeral services for Edwin G. Martin, 79, who prior to 1929 was for many years business manager for the Brooklyn Eagle, were held yesterday afternoon in the Fox Funeral Home, 98-07 Ascan Ave., Forest Hills. Interment was in Cedar Grove Cemetery, Flushing.

A simple but impressive Universalist service was conducted by the Rev. Dr. Cornelius Greenway, pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, who paid tribute to the "great simplicity" of the deceased. Mr. Martin had been a trustee of All Souls Church and a president of the church's Men's Club.

The service included the reading of several stanzas from John Greenleaf Whittier's poem on immortality, "The Eternal Goodness," and Julian Cutler's "In Memoriam." There were many floral tributes, including those from friends in the newspaper world and a wreath from the officers and members of the Publishers Association of New York City.

Mr. Martin, who died Saturday at his home, 100-07 73d Road, Forest Hills, was twice elected chairman of the Publishers Association, serving from 1934 to 1937.

Surviving Mr. Martin are his widow, the former Alice Burroughs, and three children, Edwin G., Jr., Malcolm S. and Dorothy, who is Mrs. Wesley C. Miller of Hollywood, Cal., and four grandchildren.
