## McLouth

The many friends of Louis H. McLouth and family heard with sorrow of his death which occurred at the Clifton Springs Sanitarium on Friday. Mr. McLouth had suffered from a serious stomach trouble all winter. Lately an operation was decided upon as the only chance of saving his life and he was removed to the Sanitarium for that purpose. The operation was performed, last week, showing a most serious condition, and he was unable to rally.

Mr. McLouth was born in Farmington, September 19, 1850, and was the son of Marshall McLouth and Margaret Pratt. He was educated at Macedon and Canandaigua Academy, after which he taught school and later engaged in farming. For twelve years he was town assessor and filled the office of justice of the peace for one term. He was long a member of the Manchester Grange and was a member of the Universalist church of Macedon. He had excellent business judgment, was strictly honest in his dealings and was a devout Christian character. He was deeply esteemed by his friends, of whom he had very many.

In 1912 Mr. McLouth sold his farm and moved to Clifton Springs and associated with his son in the real estate business. Mr. McLouth is survived by his wife, Celia Thayer McLouth; two sons, Wells G. of this village and Marshall Thayer McLouth of Macedon; one daughter, Mrs. Louie [Louis] H. Fish of Clifton Springs; two sisters, Mrs. Mary Howard and Mrs. E. A. Adams, both of Farmington, and eight grandchildren.

The funeral was held at the home on Monday afternoon and was largely attended. Rev. S. H. Adams, D.D., officiated, and was assisted by Rev. Dr. Porter, pastor of the Universalist church of Macedon. Interment was made in South Perinton cemetery.
