Widow Dies Within Six Months of Metcalfe, L. I. President

Mrs. Frances Taylor Metcalfe, of 758 Tuckahoe Road, widow of Dr. Tristram Walker Metcalf, president of Long Island University, died yesterday at the age of seventy-one. She had been suffering a heart ailment for the last three months.

Her husband, a leading educator in the East and a former member of the Yonkers Board of Education, died Feb. 24.

She was the mother of Tristram Walker Metcalfe 2nd of 21 Puritan Avenue, an executor of the Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation in New York City.

Also surviving are a brother, Sheldon A. Taylor of East Weare, N.H., and two grandchildren.

Mrs. Metcalfe was born in Brooklyn and was graduated in 1900 from Pratt Institute there. She taught in the kindergartens of Brooklyn public schools before her marriage in 1907. She was active afterward in the work of the Parent-Teacher Associations in Yonkers.

Mrs. Metcalfe was a lifelong member of All Souls Universalist Church in Brooklyn. A funeral service will be conducted tomorrow at 8 P.M. at the Fairchild Chapel, 951 Atlantic Avenue, Brooklyn.
