MRS. CHARLES F. MIGNIN

Death of Mrs. Charles F. Mignin, 82, occurred on Thursday, Jan. 1st, at Warsaw hospital. Mrs. Mignin had returned to the hospital the previous day following her return to their farm home on the Middle Reservation road after recent treatment at the hospital.

Gertrude Taber Mignin was born on Jan. 21, 1871, on the Taber homestead farm that was her home at the time of her death. She was one of two children of Harmon E. and Jennie Pettibone Taber. She attended Buchtel College at Akron, O., now the University of Akron, where she met Charles F. Mignin, a medical student. After he graduated and started medical practice in Stryker, Ohio, they were united in marriage at the homestead farm in 1898 and made their home in Stryker until the death of her father, when he took leave of absence from his practice and they came to the farm in 1908, intending to remain about a year. During that time he became interested in the farm and the breeding of Guernsey cattle, abandoning his idea of resuming medical practice, and they remained to make the farm their permanent home.

Mrs. Mignin was a member of the Universalist church of Perry, and the Castile Grange. She had been in failing health for several months.

She is survived by her husband and by one sister, Mrs. Isabelle Taber Crounse, recently of Batavia, who has made her home at the farm for the past year.

Services were held from her late home on Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. Fred LeShane of the Universalist Church officiating. Interment was in the Reservation cemetery.
