—Luman P. Miller, one of the oldest citizens of Victor, died at his home in that place on Thursday evening, after a lingering illness. Mr. Miller was one of Victor's best-known residents and was well known throughout Western New York. He was born in Oriskany Falls, N.Y., November 9, 1818 and came to Victor in the year 1819. His father then located on the farm where his son lived all his life, a short distance southwest of the village. In 1859 he married Mrs. M. Humphrey Smith of Victor, who still survives him. He was a supporter of the St. Paul's Universalist Church, holding the office of deacon in the same. He was a life-long Republican, and had held several offices in that party, besides being the county superintendent of the poor for three terms. Besides a wife, he leaves one son, Charles B. Miller of South Norwalk, Connecticut. The funeral services were held yesterday afternoon, Rev. H. B. Bard, pastor of St. Paul's Universalist Church, officiating.
