He leaves a daughter, Miss Carrie J. Misner of this village; three sons, Ray Misner of Lockport and Francis and Clarence of this place; and three brothers, Henry Misner of Poughkeepsie, Herman of Los Angeles and Frank of Little Falls. The funeral will be held from the late home at 2 p.m. Tuesday, Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton of the Universalist church officiating, and interment will be made in the local cemetery.
