DEATH OF GEORGE A. MOORE

Mr. George A. Moore died at this late home, No. 220 Hudson Street, last evening after an illness of about three weeks' duration, pneumonia being the cause of death.

Mr. Moore was one of the oldest and best known residents of Buffalo. He was 77 years of age, and came here in 1835. He was formerly identified with mercantile pursuits. Of late years he had not been in active business. He was a prominent Odd Fellow and a member of Mount Vernon Encampment and of Niagara Lodge No. 235. He was for over 50 years a member of the Church of the Messiah [Universalist] and many years one of its trustees. He was a well known member of the Erie county Agricultural Society. Mr. Moore was a man of most exemplary character, of the highest integrity in his business relations, and most loveable as a friend and father. His wife died some six years ago and he leaves surviving him a large family of children, including Theodore M. Moore, Louise Moore, Alice O. Moore, Marion O. Moore, all of this city; Mrs. D. W. Allen of Washington, D.C.; Norman T. Moore of Springville, Fred B. Moore of Gowanda, and Mrs. B. M. Fish of Hamburg. The notice of funeral will be given hereafter.

THE LATE GEORGE A. MOORE  
For More Than 50 years a Well-Known Merchant of Buffalo

Few portraits of Buffalo' representative business men would be more generally recognized in this community than that of the late George A. Moore, whose death from pneumonia on December 28th has been chronicled. Mr. Moore came in 1835 to this city, which was afterwards and for more than half a century his place of residence. Until his withdrawal from active pursuits, he was prominent here as a business man. In all the relations of life his integrity commanded respect, and his personal qualities was [sic] such as to secure general esteem. He was for 50 years identified with the Universalist denomination in Buffalo and was trustee of the Church of the Messiah for many years until recently, and was a deacon at the time of his decease. He was a valued member of the order of Odd Fellows, belonging to the Mt. Vernon Encampment, and Niagara Lodge No. 25. He was also a prominent member of the Erie County Agricultural Society, and an active member of various charitable organizations.

Mr. Moore was 77 years of age. His wife died six years ago. Of their ten children, nine survive, namely: Mrs. Louise M. Moore, Theodore M., Alice O., Marion Moore, and Mrs. D. W. Allen of this city; John H. Moore of the U.S. Navy, Frederick B. of Gowanda, Norman T. of Springville, and Mrs. B.M. Fish of Hamburg. He leaves one sister, Mrs. S.W. Cateley of Cortland, this State.
