DEATHS.

In Arkwright, June 30th, after a severe illness of nine weeks, Mrs. RUTH MOREY, consort of Samuel A. Morey, aged 47 years. She was a firm and undoubting believer in the peace giving doctrine of the final restitution of all things. In this belief she lived, adorned by all the Christian graces; and by it she was sustained and comforted during her sickness and in the hour of death; convincing all that knew her in health, sickness, and death, that Universalism not only would do to live by, but that it would console and support the sick and dying, by lighting up the darkness of the tomb and pointing to the haven of rest and land of repose. She has left a companion and several children to mourn her loss; but they mourn not as those who have no hope. Her funeral was attended July 1st; but there being no Universalist preacher to be obtained, as was the request of the deceased, a discourse was delivered by Rev. Mr. Emery, Presbyterian; and to his praise let it be said, he did not attempt to harrow up the feelings of the relations and friends, by the cruel dogmas of Partialism.
