In this city, October 10, Mrs. JANE MORRILL, aged 37 years. By this sudden and unexpected dispensation of Divine Providence, Br. Morrill is bereaved of a kind and amiable companion, and three children, one of whom is an infant, of a tender and affectionate mother. The deceased, as we learn, seems to have had a presentiment of her immediate death. A few days before she died, and while apparently in health, she sat down and wrote a letter to her husband, who was in Lockport on business, and detained longer than he expected, that she had been to the gate in the dooryard and returned for the last time, and that she should [would] never see him again in this world; and this proved but too true... Funeral services were attended by the writer, on the 12th inst.
