MRS.CARRIE MOSES DIED AFTER SHOCK Well Known Former Resident of Whitesville Was Stricken While Driving Car Home from Step-Father's Funeral

Stricken with a shock [a stroke] last Wednesday afternoon as she was driving the family car home to Wellsville, after having attended the funeral of her step-father, Byron E. White, in this village, Carrie Moses died the following evening at her home in Wellsville.

A friend, Mrs. M. Perkins of Wellsville, was with Mrs. Moses and she succeeded in keeping the car controlled until it could be stopped.

Carrie Moses, who was fifty-six years of age, was the daughter of Horatio and Adell Richardson Darling and was born in Hallsport on Feb. 6, 1873. Most of her life was spent here in Whitesville with the exception of a few years in Oneonta and three years in Wellsville. She was united in marriage with Cyrus G. Moses in 1890 and is survived by her husband, one son, Carl Moses, of Almond, and one daughter, Mrs. Harr[y] Stadelman, of Hornell, besides two sisters, Mrs. B. M. Wilson of this village, [and] Mrs. Kate Clark of Fulmer Valley and a brother, Fred White of Rochester.

The funeral was held from the late home, 162 North Main street, in Wellsville, Saturday afternoon at 2:30. The Rev. C. L. Paddock of Gardner, Mass., formerly pastor of the Universalist Church in Whitesville, officiated, and interment was in Rural cemetery.
