The Funeral of Mary Moulton An Abundance of Flowers and Interment at Fort Hill

The funeral of Mary Moulton was held from the residence, 196 State street, at 3:30 this afternoon.

The remains were dressed in an all satin cream colored robe, with handmade lace trimmings, and rested in an exceptionally beautiful casket in the parlor of the residence. The casket was covered with drab cloth trimmed with rope moulding and enameled silver handles. The interior was trimmed with full cream colored tufted satin, making a handsome effect.

On the top of the coffin was a large cross of roses and lilies with green effect, a small anchor of carnations, lilies, tea and other roses. At the head of the bier was a pillow shaped in roses, calla lilies etc. with the words "Best" in immortelles. At the left of the head was a large cross of exquisite flowers and a large wreath of calla lilies.

The burial service and the scripture were read by Rev. Mr. Bartholomew, pastor of the Universalist church who also officiated at the grave. There was no sermon. There were three hacks to convey the mourners to Fort Hill where the remains were interred in the family plot.
