Rites on Tuesday for Mrs. Murphy

Funeral services for Mrs. Addie Murphy, mother of the late Frederick W. Murphy, well-known attorney and prominent football man, will be held at 4:30 p.m. tomorrow in her home, 630 E. 24th St. Mrs. Murphy, the widow of John W. Murphy, died Saturday evening in St. John's Hospital of injuries suffered in a fall at her home a week ago.

The Rev. Cornelius Greenway, pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, where Mrs. Murphy was an active member for many years, will officiate at the services. The body will be sent to Dover, N.H., Mrs. Murphy's birthplace, for burial at 11 a.m. Wednesday.

Frederick Murphy, who died about a year ago, was best known for his football activities. Before starting his law practice he had been football coach at Amherst, University of Missouri, Phillips Exeter Academy and Brown University, where he had previously been a star end. At the time of his death he was president of the Touchdown Club.

The daughter of John and Eliza Davis, Mrs. Murphy came to Brooklyn in 1903, soon after her marriage, and since than had lived at the E. 24th St. address. She was a leading member of the Women's League of All Souls Church, and had been prominent in all women's activities at the church. Her only immediate survivor is a daughter, Miss Grace E. Murphy.
