MRS. HERBERT PALMER DIES IN RICHMOND HILL Aunt of Putnam's Welfare Commissioner Succumbs in 76th Year, Tuesday. Burial Here Today

Mrs. Eleanor Hagaman Palmer, widow of the late Herbert Palmer, and aunt of Welfare Commissioner Ralph S. Palmer, died on Tuesday evening, March 23, 1937, in the Chapin Home¹ at Richmond Hill, L. I., where she had lived for the past six or eight years. Death was caused by a heart ailment.

She was born in Peekskill where her girlhood was spent. After her marriage to Herbert Palmer, they lived in Danbury until 1905 when Mr. Palmer died and Mrs. Palmer later moved to Stamford, Conn., where she remained until she went to Chapin Home to be with an older sister. She was a member of the Universalist Church. She visited in Carmel frequently in her younger days and will be remembered by many of the older residents.

Besides several nieces and nephews one sister, Miss Elizabeth Hagaman, survives.

Funeral services were conducted at the Chapin Home this Friday morning and the body was brought to Carmel and interment made beside her late husband in the family plot in Raymond Hill Cemetery. Several relatives and friends in this section attended the committal services at the grave.
