DEATH OF H. C. PALMER It Took Place in Danbury on Saturday

Carmel was pained to hear of the death of Herbert C. Palmer at his home in Danbury on Saturday last. It terminated a fierce attack of pneumonia of eight days duration. He was taken sick on the anniversary of an operation he submitted to on March 10, 1904, in New York, for intestinal abscesses. It was a success and he was in excellent health when attacked by pneumonia which proved fatal. An autopsy was had which demonstrated that the operation was a complete success and had nothing to do with his last illness.

Mr. Palmer was born at Long Ridge, Conn., about 51 years ago. He was the son of the late Charles J. and Maryett Palmer. He had three sisters, one of whom survives, Mrs. L. J. Quick of Schenectady, and one brother, Bryant S. Palmer of Carmel. He came to Carmel to be associated with his brother in 1871 and remained here until about 15 years ago, when he married Miss Ella Heggeman of Danbury and went there to live and where he has been in business ever since.

Mr. Palmer was a trustee of the Universalist church in Danbury and took active interest in its work, taking a large part in its social life. He was also a member of the Royal Arcanum and his widow will get an insurance of about \$8,000.

The funeral services were conducted at his late residence by his pastor, Rev. Mr. Cardell, on Monday evening. Mr. and Mrs. Palmer of this place were present as was Mrs. Quick and son, Delmar, of Schenectady. The health of his mother prevented the attendance of Mr. Quick.

The body was brought to Carmel Tuesday and placed in the vault for interment later in the Palmer family plot on Raymond Hill Cemetery.

The sympathy of this entire community goes out to the bereaved family and the widow, who is well known in Carmel from her frequent visits to this place.
