Sudden Death of L. H. Park.

Loren H. Park, an old resident of this town, died at his residence west of Corbett's Corners, some time Friday night, having been found dead by his wife at five o'clock Saturday morning. Several years ago he had a light stroke of paralysis and about a year and a half since quite a severe one. It is supposed death resulted from a third attack. Since the second stroke he had been quite poorly, though much better during the past month or two. Friday he was not feeling as well as usual and retired early. His wife was caring for a grandchild in another room and his death was not discovered until she got up in the morning.

Deceased was born in Sherman June 20, 1839, on the farm near which he has always lived. He was married about 40 years ago to Miss Nettie Lyon, who with two sons, John and Lee, survive, all residents of this town. One brother, Marvin Park of this town, and a sister, Mrs. Martha Pabody of Ripley, remain of his father's family.

Mr. Park was a good citizen, a kind-hearted neighbor, honest in his dealings and respected by all who knew him. The funeral was held at his late residence Monday afternoon, Rev. A. [Alfred] R. Fiske [Universalist] officiating. Burial in the Sherman Center cemetery, the first in the new addition recently secured. Those from away were Mr. Cummings of Fredonia; Mary Lyon of Stockton and Mr. and Mrs. Hiram Gates, Panama.
