OBITUARY.

Died, in Sherman, Jan. 28, 1888, Warren, son of Stephen and Fannie Parker, aged 8 years, nearly.

Little Warren was taken sick two weeks ago Sunday, and at first it was supposed that he had scarletina. He had all the symptoms except the rash, but the fever, instead of moderating after a few days as usual in that disease, continued to run at a dangerous point, though somewhat remittent in form. The continued high fever was more than his naturally frail constitution could bear, and it is probable that the heart was unable to do its work, and he sank suddenly to his final sleep, at seven o'clock Saturday evening, perfectly conscious to nearly the end. He was a bright boy, of an unusually loving and obedient nature, and his death is a terrible blow to his parents, who are thus bereft of their only child. The deepest sympathy of many friends is extended to them in their affliction.

The funeral was held at the house Monday at 2 p.m., Rev. [Frank J.] Chase [Universalist] conducting a brief service.
