DEATHS.

In Sullivan, Madison Co., on the 28th of April, after a very brief illness of three days, Jacob Patrick, Esq., in the 87th year of his age. He was one of the patriarchs of Universalism in this region, having for a great number of years professed, adorned, and enjoyed its precious faith, its sublime hopes, and its heavenly consolations. He was also a Mason, and for many years Master of the Lodge where he resided. On the recent re-organization of that ancient fraternity at Chittenango, he attended and made the request that when he died, (which event he believed was near) he might be buried with the honors and according to the ancient usages of Masonry. His request was complied with, the Lodge and members of the fraternity in the region generally turning out on the occasion. His funeral was attended at the Universalist church in Sullivan, on the 30th, and a sermon preached by the writer of this to his surviving widow (with whom he had happily lived over 60 years) and a numerous circle of kindred and sympathizing friends, from 2 Cor., v.1.
