T. W. PEACOCK DIES ON ANNIVERSARY OF WIFE'S DEMISE

Thomas W. Peacock, aged 83, died early this morning at his home, No. 18 Liberty Street, after a short illness from stomach trouble.

Mr. Peacock was born in the town of Fleming and with the exception of a few years in Worcester, Mass., had spent his life here. He conducted a grocery store at 1 North Street for many years and later in State Street but retired from active business life some years ago.

He was the oldest member of Auburn Lodge of Masons, having joined in 1861, and a long-time member of the First Universalist Church. He had occupied the same pew there for over 40 years.

Mr. Peacock was the last of a family of seven, and is survived by three sons, Charles, Howard and Ray, all of this city, Mrs. Peacock having died in 1882 on this same date.

Funeral services will be held at his late home, Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. H. M. Cary will officiate and the Auburn Lodge of Masons will assist in the ceremonies. Interment will be made in Soule Cemetery.
