Mrs. Lovina Pellet, aged 88 years, died at her residence one-half mile west of here, Sunday morning, the 3d inst., of paralysis. She was stricken the Monday noon previous to her death, and never rallied, but passed peacefully away. Mrs. Pellet's maiden name was Gibson. She was born in Esperance, in Schoharie Co., this state, Aug. 15, 1801, was married to Archibald Pellet, of Norwich, Chenango Co., in 1820, and moved here in 1854. Her husband died in 1870. Two children were born to them, John W. Pellet, whose death occurred at Otisville, Mich., Jan. 1st, 1889, and Selenda W. Allen who survives her. Of a family of six brothers and sisters but one survives, viz: Waterous Gibson, of Flint, Mich.; Mrs. Irene Newbury died at Battle Creek, Mich., in 1870; Mrs. Selenda Wood died in 1879; Houdd Gibson died in 1869; and Guy Gibson in 1885. Mrs. Pellet was a woman greatly beloved by all that knew her, very domestic in her habits, and if she found anything to say of anyone it was something to praise and not condemn. She accepted the Universalist faith a great many years ago, and never wavered from it. Funeral services were held at the house Wednesday, the 6th inst., Rev. Thomas Borden, of Albion, officiating.
