Dr. William H. Petrie Succumbs At Dolgeville

Dolgeville, Mar. 12.—Dr. William H. Petrie, 57, well known physician of this village and highly esteemed resident of the community, died at his home here Friday following a short illness. He was a native of the town of Manheim, a graduate of Albany Medical College, and had practiced medicine at Gray, and in this village since 1908.

He served as coroner for several years, was a member of the village board and was medical examiner of Dolgeville schools. He was a member of the Masonic and I.O.O.F. lodges, the Exchange Club and Herkimer County Medical Society.

Surviving are his wife, the former Miss Anna Green of Kerhonkson; two sons, W. Arnold and Robert Petrie of this village; a daughter, Mrs. Gordon Snyder of Boonville; and a brother Charles Petrie of Dolgeville.

One of Dolgeville's foremost citizens has been Dr. William H. Petrie and his death on March 11, by a paralytic shock [stroke] has given the town a real sorrow and loss.
