DEATH OF MRS. CORNELIA W. PHILLIPS AT SYRACUSE

Word has been received of the death in Syracuse on Tuesday, Feb. 23rd, of Mrs. Cornelia Whitney Phillips, wife of William Howard Phillips. Mrs. Phillips was born at Bucks Bridge, and was a member of those two fine old Canton families, the Whitneys and the Johnsons. The funeral was held from the Phillips home at 233 Fitch street in that city on Feb. 25th and burial was in Syracuse Morningside cemetery.
