Irving Henry Pickard, a resident of Perry for the past 25 years, passed away on Saturday, May 9, at his home at 14 Bradford Street. His age was 61 years. Mr. Pickard's health had not been good for a year, and he had been confined to the bed for two weeks previous to his death.

He was born at West Sparta, N.Y., in 1864, a son of Benjamin and Catherin Thompson Pickard. When a young man he moved to Nunda, where he was united in marriage to Miss Mae McKeowen in 1889. They lived in Nunda for a short time and then in Warsaw for ten years, coming from there to Perry in 1900. He was employed in the Robeson cutlery factory about ten years, and then followed his trade of carpenter. He was a member of the Woodmen of the World, Tribe of Ben Hur and Loyal Order of Moose.

Funeral services were held at his late home on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. William J. Metz of the Universalist Church officiated. Burial was in Glenwood Cemetery.

Besides his wife he is survived by a half-sister, Mrs. Wm. Copp of Fairport; a nephew, Claude Pickard, and a niece, Mrs. Edward Aubert of Buffalo. Relatives and friends were present from Fairport and Castile.
