She is also survived by her husband, 14 grandchildren, and two sisters, Mrs. Byron Dawley of Canandaigua, and Mrs. C. F. Davis of Rochester. Mrs. Pierce was 58 years, 8 months and 14 days old. She attended the Universalist church here. There was a prayer at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Hurlbut, on Sunday, by Rev. G. L. Morrill, and services at her late home at 2 o'clock, at which Rev. Flower officiated. Burial was in Evergreen cemetery.
