DIED—In Salamanca, Dec. 23, 1866, of congestion of the brain, Miss Ada Potter, aged 20 years. She was a universal favorite—remarkable for the sweetness of her disposition, the amiability of her character, and the purity of her life. Reared in the Universalist faith, she enjoyed its hopes, loved its promises, and exemplified its precepts. For twelve years she had been connected with our Sabbath School in Friendship, and as scholar or teacher she was always faithful. Indeed, it was the great aim of her life to do right... Her funeral was attended in the Universalist church in Friendship, and the consolations of the Gospel were presented to a large congregation by Rev. E. W.[Winchester] Fuller.
