Pittsford, June 6.—Mrs. Matilda Mann Pugsley, widow of James Pugsley, passed away Sunday morning, aged 88 years. Mrs. Puglsey was the elder daughter of the late Catherine and Joseph Mann and was born near Harrisburg, Pa., February 4, 1834. When she was four years old, the family moved to New York state and located one mile from East Rush, later known as "Mann's Corners," and remained there until her marriage, September 29, 1859, to James Pugsley, whom she survived twelve years. After a brief residence in Perinton after her marriage they located in Pittsford and for 40 years lived on the farm three miles from this village on the Pittsford-Mendon road. The last twelve years of her life were spent in this village. Earlier in life Mrs. Pugsley was identified with the Universalist church at Victor and continued in that faith. Mrs. Pugsley is survived by four sons: Torence J. and Orville Pugsley of Rochester, Frank W. Pugsley of Pittsford and Floyd M. Pugsley of Bradford, Pa.; three grandchildren, Mrs. William McCoy of Riverton, Va., Howard and Kenneth Pugsley of Rochester, and one sister, Mrs. Lucinda Simmons.

The funeral service was held on Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from her home, Rev. Frank J. Palmer of Parma officiating. Interment was made in the Pittsford cemetery.
