Fowler, St. Lawrence Co. NY (Hailesboro)

Be it remembered that on the third day of January 1861 at the new meeting house in Hailsboro [sic] in the Town of Fowler in pursuance of public notice duly & legally given in the congregation on two successive Sundays the first of which was more than fifteen days before the date hereof, a Society meeting of the persons of full age who statedly worship in this congregation & who have formerly been considered as belonging thereto was duly held for the purpose of legally organizing a Society. That at such meeting the subscribers were duly appointed presiding officers. That it was duly ordered by said meeting that three Trustees of such society be elected that the name of such Society shall [be] "The Universalist Union Society of Hailsboro" and thereupon Francis Farmer, William T. Burt and Daniel G. Sartwell were by a majority of voices at said meeting duly elected Trustees of said Society.

In Testimony Whereof the presiding officers of said meeting have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this third day of January A.D. 1861[.]
