

**Hastings, Oswego Co. NY
(Central Square)**

Be it remembered that at a meeting of the male members of the Universalist Society held at Central Square in the town of Hastings at their usual place of worship on the twenty-eighth day of February 1833 pursuant to public notice & previous adjournment and according to Statute incorporating and regulating religious Societies in such case made and provided[,] David Eggleston and Edw. M. Fitch were duly nominated and elected to preside at said Meeting and to certify and return the proceedings thereof to the Clerk of said County—that at said Meeting it was unanimously resolved and agreed that said Society should forever hereafter be known and distinguished by the name and title of “The First Universalist Society in Hastings”[,] that the following persons were then duly elected trustees of the said Society (to wit) Rudolph Devendorf, Huntington Fitch, John Russell, David Egleston, Jedediah Morse and David Mosher and that said trustees and their successors shall forever hereafter be known and called by the name and title of the Trustees of the First Universalist Society in Hastings. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and year above written.
