New Pastor for the Church of the Good Tidings

Last night the congregation of the Church of the Good Tidings, Quincy street near Reid avenue, unanimously elected the Rev. H. A. Yantas, now of Menden, N.Y., to the vacant pastorate. Mr. Yantas has already occupied the pulpit in the Church of the Good Tidings on several occasions and created an excellent impression. He is about 28 years old, and a man of fine presence as well as an eloquent speaker. He formerly lived in the South and was educated for a lawyer. He has been studying theology with the Rev. Arthur Rogers of Washington, D.C. It is expected that Mr. Yantas will begin active work in Brooklyn early in June.

The Church of the Good Tidings was organized about eleven years ago, and the pastorate has successively been held by the Rev. Abram Conklin, Dr. J. R. Taber and the Rev. M. C. Crossley. The congregation comprises many of the most prominent Universalists in the upper section of the city.
